





A short guide to EYFDM

The European Young Family Doctors' Movement

What this is all about?

To understand what EYFDM is, it's good to make yourself familiar with two other organisations: **WONCA World** and **WONCA Europe**. WONCA World is a professional organisation representing family physicians and general practitioners from all over the world. WONCA Europe is its European branch. **The European Young Family Doctors' Movement** is a part of WONCA Europe, but it's created and run solely by and for **young doctors**.

Who is a young doctor, then?

"**Young doctor**" is defined as an early career family doctor (FD - also known as a general practitioner, or GP). So if you are a resident or within five years of completing training, you are a "young doctor". As a "young doctor" within WONCA you are automatically a EYFDM member.

What is the mission of EYFDM?

EYFDM envisions a world where young family doctors are empowered, connected, supported and heard; where the profession of family medicine is **innovative, influential & academically robust**; where family doctors and our speciality are recognised and respected as an **essential** component of primary care.

What if I am interested in certain areas of family medicine?

Family medicine covers a wide spectrum of medical areas and each GP can have different fields of interest. For those who want to develop and focus on a particular aspect of general practice, Special Interest Groups (**SIGs**) have been created.

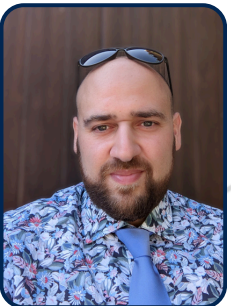

Being Young, Staying Young Award (BYSY) 2024

Every two years, EYFDM awards the 'Being Young Staying Young Award' to recognise an individual of significance within the wider EYFDM community who, over a prolonged period of time, has made a valuable contribution to the movement. This year, **Dr Steve Mowle** (UK) was the successful recipient and he joined us at the EYFDM Forum in Vienna to receive the award and address our members.



Steve has supported EYFDM both within the UK and now more widely within WONCA over many years. He helped to set-up the UK branch of EYFDM, the Junior International Committee. As a leader within the UK's WONCA member organisation, he also helped make sure that the 7th EYFDM Forum in 2022 could go ahead, despite the still lingering Covid-19 pandemic. He joined us again in Vienna and gave an inspiring speech about how to make the most of our careers as family doctors.



JUNIOR RESEARCHER AWARD (JRA) 2023

The three JRA finalists presented their research at the WONCA Europe conference in Brussels and **Katrien Danhieux** from Belgium won with her research project entitled: **Scale-up of a chronic care model-based programme for type 2 diabetes in Belgium: a mixed-methods study**

Katrien Danhieux is a general practitioner since 2018. She has experience in various types of primary care practices and in multidisciplinary collaboration. After her Advanced Master of Medicine in Family medicine at the University of Ghent she decided to study further and completed the Postgraduate course Introduction to International Health at the Institute of Medicine in Antwerp. Her interest in health systems had been sparked and motivated by experiencing herself as a provider the benefits and drawbacks of the primary health care system in Belgium she decided to conduct a PhD at the University of Antwerp.

The runners-up for the 2023 JRA award were Dr Sophie Sun (France) and Dr Raisa Álvarez Paniagua (Spain).

The Bridge Project - third edition

The Bridge Project was an initiative pioneered during the pandemic to link EYFDM members working in different countries so they could work together on areas of common interest. This first two editions were then presented during a symposium at WONCA Europe 2023 in Brussels.



A third edition of the Bridge Project kicked off in 2024, this time opening the opportunity to young doctors within EYFDM and beyond. Ninety-five people applied to take part and they have worked together this year in 15 groups.

Advocacy and representation within WONCA

EYFDM is represented on the board of WONCA Europe by Dr Aaron Poppleton and we also practice advocacy in other ways. Dr Ana Cristina Franco Spinola represents us on the executive group of the WONCA Europe Working Party on Policy and Advocacy, with others as members. EYFDM has pioneered making family medicine conferences ‘family friendly,’ so that new parents can continue to be involved in our activities and community.

FUNDRAISING & TREASURY

HOW IS EYFDM FUNDED?

Every year we receive a sum of money from WONCA Europe as one of its networks. This allows EYFDM to fund our awards including research and exchange awards, it also allows us to support the Executive in their day-to-day functions. EYFDM also takes donations for the EYFDM Fund. The money in this fund is protected and dedicated to provide bursaries and subsidies to support EYFDM Members to participate in the EYFDM Forum, the EYFDM Preconference and WONCA Europe Conference.

We use the EYFDM Fund specially to support those who are from lower- and middle-income countries, aiding in spreading the EYFDM Virus across Europe! In 2021 we added the "HOC Support Fund" to the EYFDM Fund. This fund aims to support Host Organising Committees (HOCs) of EYFDM Forums and Pre-conferences, who are in a financially challenging situation. Any donations you give us are 100% used for the EYFDM Fund, and therefore 100% given to support our members in need of financial assistance. The more donations we receive, the more we can support!

HOW DID WE DO LAST YEAR?

In 2023 we finished the year €2,000 in surplus in our operational budget, thanks to a more generous than expected contribution to EYFDM from WONCA Europe, for which we are most grateful. We entered 2024 with over €18,000 in our reserves for EYFDM's operational budget. We are on course to finish 2024 in slight surplus of this year's projected budget.

The 'EYFDM Fund' was well used in the past 12 months. We disbursed €4,200 in bursaries to 14 EYFDM members to attend WONCA Europe 2023 in Brussels, and we disbursed €3,000 in bursaries to three EYFDM members to enable them to attend the Forum in Vienna in 2024. Neither the Brussels or Vienna host organising committees required subsidy from EYFDM, so we will roll that money over to 2024-25 for future HOCs. Thanks to a very successful fundraising campaign and lottery during WONCA Europe, organised by our Awards & Fundraising officer Marta Kurdzielewicz, the EYFDM Fund received a total donation of €3,823.20. With this money we will continue to support EYFDM members from lower- and middle-income countries and HOCs that are in need of financial support!

EXCHANGES

Exchanges are at the heart of EYFDM, read on to learn more about the opportunities that we offer.

WHAT SORT OF EXCHANGES DO WE OFFER?

CONFERENCE EXCHANGES are short-term exchanges held around national family medicine conferences. They are short-term exchanges which give a group of participants an observational experience in primary care, followed by attendance at the national conference. They are a great way into EYFDM - it's easy to come along even if you don't know anyone and get to know the community.

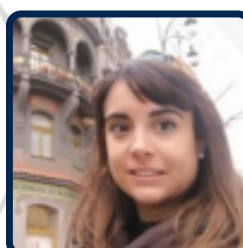
The **FAMILY MEDICINE 360° Programme (FM360)** is a global exchange programme for medical doctors training in Family Medicine/General Practice and junior Family Doctors/General Practitioners (within five years of completing residency training). It enables participants to spend up to four weeks visiting the primary healthcare system of a different country anywhere in the world. The Family Medicine 360° Program was formally launched in 2013 during the 20th WONCA World Conference in Prague. Its aim is to promote intercultural exchanges, so as to give doctors an opportunity to learn from each other in different cultural and socio-economic contexts.

Aside from being an opportunity to broaden one's professional and personal horizons, these exchanges provide the possibility to interact with different primary care settings and health care systems in general. The exchange programme is based on and developed by young doctor's movements worldwide and supported by WONCA World. In order to provide a standardised educational experience, the Family Medicine 360° Programme is built on a special framework based on learning objectives and outcomes. At the end, participants are invited to reflect on their experience, before and after the exchange, and to write a final report. The exchange programme is financially self-supported by participants, who are expected to cover their travel and accommodation expenses. However, hosts are very welcomed to assist participants in providing options for accommodation.

2023 saw the renaissance of FM 360 after the pandemic, with our first exchange to Sri Lanka taking place! Hopefully more will follow in the next year.

EXCHANGES

The **HIPPOKRATES EXCHANGE** is an exchange program for early career Family Doctors. The programme is supported by WONCA Europe and by the European Academy of Teachers in General Practice (EURACT). The aim of Hippokrates is to encourage exchange and mobility among young doctors in the course of their professional formation thus providing a broader perspective to the concepts of Family Medicine at both professional and personal levels.

Participants of the program acquire an insight into the context of family medicine in the primary healthcare system of other European countries either by hosting an exchange participant or visiting a GP practice in another country. Through this they gain knowledge that will inspire them to undertake an active part in the development of Family Medicine at all levels.

Furthermore the programme enhances the collaboration among national colleges of Family Medicine and the recruitment of young professionals to these.

At the individual level the acquisitions are numerous: an international experience in a vocational setting, improving knowledge and skills, inspirational introduction to methods of professional development for lifelong learning, improving language skills, creating new friendships.

The duration of an Exchange is normally two weeks; in some cases one week is acceptable. During this time the visitor will obtain an introduction to the aspects and the role of Family Medicine in the respective country by shadowing all activities of the Host Practice. The visitor should also meet, follow and exchange views with the local trainees specialising in Family Medicine and will be encouraged to gain insight into local resources and quality improvement activities.

In 2022, EYFDM members completed 18 Hippokrates Exchanges, and in 2023 there were 11. This is a great achievement considering we had zero in 2021 thanks to the Covid-19 pandemic.

THIS YEAR'S EVENTS

EYFDM pre-conference at WONCA Europe 2023 in Brussels

The European Young Family Doctors' Movement (EYFDM) Preconference took place in Brussels on June 6-7, 2023, ahead of the WONCA Europe conference. With a total of 140 participants (sold out!), the event aimed to support young family doctors in navigating professional and personal challenges.



The scientific program was centered around the theme "You Can't Always Get What You Want" and included workshops on the patient-doctor relationship, work-life balance, and dealing with medical dilemmas.

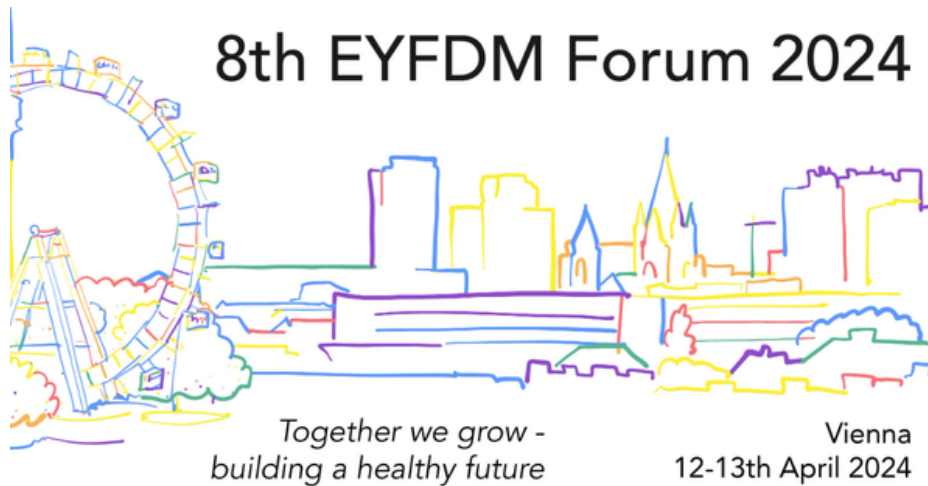
Keynote sessions and parallel workshops covered topics like palliative care, antimicrobial use, and gender-sensitive medicine. Katelijne Baetens delivered a keynote speech on how to become the family doctor you want to be, offering valuable insights to young practitioners.

The event also emphasized community building through various social activities. Participants enjoyed a city game, a European Parliament visit, and a beer and chocolate tasting, culminating in an international food party and a lively dinner followed by dancing. The event was family-friendly, offering amenities for parents and children, enhancing the inclusive atmosphere.



THIS YEAR'S EVENTS

8th EYFDM Forum in Vienna, April 2024



In April 2024, the 8th EYFDM Forum (with the theme “Together we grow - building a healthy future”) achieved something memorable. 260 young family doctors from 34 countries met in Vienna to celebrate family medicine. We gathered together, formed teams, and exchanged experiences from all across Europe.

We had inspiring keynotes about wellbeing by Dr Andrée Rochfort, we learned to care not only for the patients but also about ourselves. Prof. Shlomo Vinker (WONCA Europe President) spoke about the future of General Practice, encouraging and inspiring us to develop ourselves and the profession further. Dr Cheryl Chan (WONCA World Young Family Doctor Lead) shared news from Young Family Doctors across the globe, providing us with passion to make connections. We heard cutting edge talks on artificial intelligence, weight management strategies, and fake news in healthcare, as well as considering how to be a leader in family medicine.

Thanks to the generous hospitality of Austrian colleagues, 27 conference participants were able to visit and get a taste of family medicine in practices across Austria.

In keeping with the welcoming and inclusive aims of the conference, the Forum was family friendly. A number of attendees brought their children to the meetings, scientific schedule sessions, and socials. Space for quiet and breastfeeding was available. The playroom with toys was also a big hit!

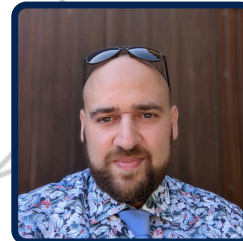

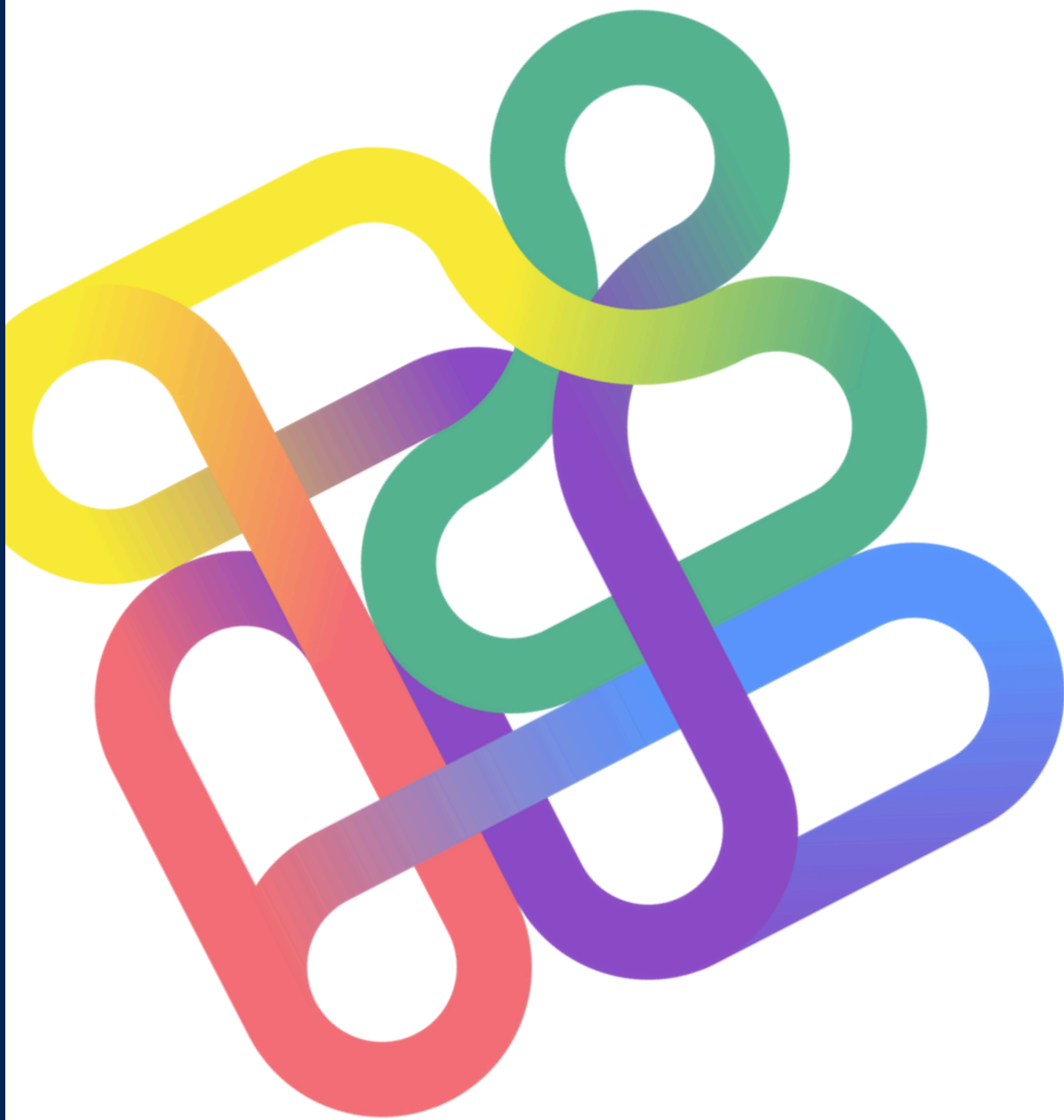
EYFDM COUNCIL
