A short guide to EYFDM The European Young Family Doctors' Movement

What this is all about?

To understand what EYFDM is, it's good to make yourself familiar with two other organisations: **WONCA World** and **WONCA Europe**. WONCA World is a professional organisation representing family physicians and general practitioners from all over the world. WONCA Europe is its European branch. **The European Young Family Doctors' Movement** is a part of WONCA Europe, but it's created and run solely by and for **young doctors**.

Who is a young doctor, then?

"Young doctor" is defined as an early career family doctor (FD - also known as a general practitioner, or GP). So if you are a resident or within five years of completing training, you are a "young doctor". As a "young doctor" within WONCA you are automatically a EYFDM member.

What is the mission of EYFDM?

EYFDM envisions a world where young family doctors are empowered, connected, supported and heard; where the profession of family medicine is **innovative**, **influential & academically robust**; where family doctors and our speciality are recognised and respected as an **essential** component of primary care.

What if I am interested in certain areas of family medicine?

Family medicine covers a wide spectrum of medical areas and each GP can have different fields of interest. For those who want to develop and focus on a particular aspect of general practice, Special Interest Groups (**SIGs**) have been created.



AWARDS

The Fons Sips Outstanding Achievement Award 2025

Every two years, EYFDM recognizes the remarkable dedication of its members by awarding the **Fons Sips Outstanding Achievement Award**. In 2021 this distinction gained an extra layer of significance, as WONCA World introduced a new prize: the **Rising Star Award**, celebrating a young doctor who has shown outstanding commitment to excellence in health care. Each of the seven Young Doctors Movements puts forward one candidate for this global honor.



This year, the Fons Sips Outstanding Achievement Award and our nomination for the WONCA World Rising Star Award go to **Raisa Álvarez Paniagua** from Spain. Her nominator, Helena Alonso Valencia, highlighted Raisa's pivotal role within EYFDM, noting her active involvement in initiatives that empower young family doctors and advance primary care education across Europe.



JUNIOR RESEARCHER AWARD (JRA) 2024

The chance to present a research project at the WONCA Europe Conference in Dublin motivated many young GPs to compete for the **Junior Researcher Award 2024**. The jury, consisting of Professor Radost Asenova, Dr Katrien Danhieux, Dr Aaron Poppleton and Dr Aileen Barrett, selected three finalists: **Thomas Cronin** (Ireland), **ikbal Hümay Arman** (Turkey) and **Charlotte Morris** (United Kingdom). The winning project came from **Charlotte**, titled: Socio-economic inequality in the quality and safety of post-diagnostic primary care for people living with dementia: a scoping review.

Charlotte is an academic GP. She trained in Cardiff, graduating with honours for her undergraduate medical training. She completed an intercalated degree in Clinical Epidemiology, and was awarded the Peter Ellwood Prize for her undergraduate dissertation. This explored factors associated with abusive head trauma, under the supervision of Prof Alison Kemp and Dr Sabine Maguire. After completing an NIHR In-Practice Fellowship, she was awarded a prestigious NIHR School for Primary Care Research Doctoral fellowship (2023). Her doctoral studies focus on health inequalities for people with dementia, using a mixed-methods.

The Bridge Project - fourth edition

The Bridge Project was an initiative pioneered during the pandemic to link EYFDM members working in different countries so they could work together on areas of common interest. The first two editions were then presented during a symposium at WONCA Europe 2023 in Brussels and the third edition has seen an incredible increase with 95 participants working in 15 groups.



The fourth edition of the Bridge Project started in April 2025 with meetings in group sessions from April up until the 1st of September, prior to the YDM Preconference, which gives participants the possibility to prepare and present their work in Lisbon.

Advocacy and representation within WONCA

EYFDM is represented on the board of WONCA Europe by Dr Aaron Poppleton and we also practice advocacy in other ways. Dr Helena Alonso Valencia represents us on the executive group of the WONCA Europe Working Party on Policy and Advocacy, with others as members. EYFDM has pioneered making family medicine conferences 'family friendly,' so that new parents can continue to be involved in our activities and community.

HOW IS EYFOM FUNDED? FUNDRAISING & TREASURY

Every year we receive a sum of money from WONCA Europe as one of its networks. This allows EYFDM to fund our awards including research and exchange awards, it also allows us to support the Executive in their day-to-day functions. EYFDM also takes donations for the EYFDM Fund. The money in this fund is protected and dedicated to provide bursaries and subsidies to support EYFDM Members to participate in the EYFDM Forum, the EYFDM Preconference and WONCA Europe Conference. We use the EYFDM Fund specially to support those who are from lower- and middle-income countries, aiding in spreading the EYFDM Virus across Europe! In 2021 we added the "HOC Support Fund" to the EYFDM Fund. This fund aims to support Host Organising Committees (HOCs) of EYFDM Forums and Pre-conferences, who are in a financially challenging situation. Any donations you give us are 100% used for the EYFDM Fund, and therefore 100% given to support our members in need of financial assistance. The more donations we receive, the more we can support!

HOW DID WE DO LAST YEAR?

The events in Dublin turned out to be a great success for the EYFDM Fund. A lottery was organized to raise money in support of young family doctors from less privileged countries and collected 2992 euros. In addition, the Ministry of Health in Luxembourg supported the EYFDM Fund with a generous donation of 5,000 euros, which allowed us to increase the number of bursaries from the usual two to five.

We are delighted that the EYFDM Fund was once again able to help young family doctors take part in such inspiring and educational gatherings as the EYFDM Forum in the Grand Region and the WONCA Europe Conference in Dublin. The financial support to attend EYFDM Forum in Grand Region was given to: Oleksandra Alekseichenko - Ukraine, Lia Guledani - Georgia, Beata Virginas - Romania, Rita Abecasis - Portugal and Rafael Rios Bernabe - Spain.

The 'EYFDM Fund' was well used this past year. We granted €7552.80 in bursaries for our members : €4000 in bursaries as well as €1000 as part of our National Delegate Bursary in order for them to attend the EYFDM preconference in Dublin as well as five bursaries for the Grande Région Forum in April. Thanks also to the generosity of WONCA Europe and to a good budgeting strategy from our treasurers, we have finished our financial year with a surplus of 5800 compared to what was initially budgeted!

Neither the Dublin nor the Grande Région host organising committees required subsidy from EYFDM, so we will roll that money over to 2025-26 for future HOCs. Thanks to a very successful fundraising campaign and lottery during WONCA Europe, organised by our Awards & Fundraising officer Marta Kurdzielewicz, the EYFDM Fund received a total donation of €3,000. With this money we will continue to support EYFDM members from lower- and middle-income countries and HOCs that are in need of financial support!

EXCHANGES

Exchanges are at the heart of EYFDM, read on to learn more about the opportunities that we offer.

WHAT SORT OF EXCHANGES DO WE OFFER?

CONFERENCE EXCHANGES are short-term exchanges held around national family medicine conferences. They are short-term exchanges which give a group of participants an observational experience in primary care, followed by attendance at the national conference. They are a great way into EYFDM - it's easy to come along even if you don't know anyone and get to know the community.

The **FAMILY MEDICINE 360° Programme (FM360)** is a global exchange programme for medical doctors training in Family Medicine/General Practice and junior Family Doctors/General Practitioners (within five years of completing residency training). It enables participants to spend up to four weeks visiting the primary healthcare system of a different country anywhere in the world. The Family Medicine 360° Program was formally launched in 2013 during the 20th WONCA World Conference in Prague. Its aim is to promote intercultural exchanges, so as to give doctors an opportunity to learn from each other in different cultural and socio-economic contexts.

Aside from being an opportunity to broaden one's professional and personal horizons, these exchanges provide the possibility to interact with different primary care settings and health care systems in general. The exchange programme is based on and developed by young doctor's movements worldwide and supported by WONCA World. In order to provide a standardised educational experience, the Family Medicine 360° Programme is built on a special framework based on learning objectives and outcomes. At the end, participants are invited to reflect on their experience, before and after the exchange, and to write a final report. The exchange programme is financially self-supported by participants, who are expected to cover their travel and accommodation expenses. However, hosts are very welcomed to assist participants in providing options for accommodation.

In 2024, Cheryl, the YDM lead, alongside Rabee and Raisa, have been working hard on reinstating the FM360 Program as well as working on a new and improved platform to facilitate the exchanges.

EXCHANGES

The **HIPPOKRATES EXCHANGE** is an exchange program for early career Family Doctors. The programme is supported by WONCA Europe and by the European Academy of Teachers in General Practice (EURACT). The aim of Hippokrates is to encourage exchange and mobility among young doctors in the course of their professional formation thus providing a broader perspective to the concepts of Family Medicine at both professional and personal levels.

Participants of the program acquire an insight into the context of family medicine in the primary healthcare system of other European countries either by hosting an exchange participant or visiting a GP practice in another country. Through this they gain knowledge that will inspire them to undertake an active part in the development of Family Medicine at all levels.

Furthermore the programme enhances the collaboration among national colleges of Family Medicine and the recruitment of young professionals to these.

At the individual level the acquisitions are numerous: an international experience in a vocational setting, improving knowledge and skills, inspirational introduction to methods of professional development for lifelong learning, improving language skills, creating new friendships.

The duration of an Exchange is normally two weeks; in some cases one week is acceptable. During this time the visitor will obtain an introduction to the aspects and the role of Family Medicine in the respective country by shadowing all activities of the Host Practice. The visitor should also meet, follow and exchange views with the local trainees specialising in Family Medicine and will be encouraged to gain insight into local resources and quality improvement activities.

EYFDM pre-conference at WONCA Europe 2024 in Dublin

The European Young Family Doctors' Movement (EYFDM) Preconference took place in Dublin on the 24th and 25th of September, ahead of the WONCA Europe conference. It was the first time the Preconference took place in the same venue as the Main Conference so as to allow all young Family Doctors interested in the event to participate, without a limited participants number.



The scientific program was centered around the theme "#ProudtobeaGP" and included sessions centered around women's health, ageism and managing a correct work-life balance as a young GP.

The opening keynote by dr. Andree Rochfort from ICGP "Top Tips for Career Resilience" and the closing keynote by Dr. Laura Nielson "Dreaming, Working, Yearning, Trying, Failing, Flying & Everything Between. What it is to be a Passionate Doctor in 2024. Stories and Tips from Along the Way" emphasized the importance of our profession but also the space young family doctors need to hold for themselves and their other passions.

The event was held before the ICGP (Irish College of General Practitioners) annual conference so we had an incredible attendance from our Irish colleagues, most of them who discovered EYFDM in Dublin. There were also two social events which allowed networking amongst our members in a less formal atmosphere as well.

THIS YEAR'S EVENTS

9th EYFDM Forum in Grande Région - Germany, Luxembourg, France - April 2025



April 2025 marked a first of it's kind event for EYFDM as we proudly hosted the first three country forum: a collaboration between Germany, Luxembourg and France in the Grande Région. The event welcomed more than 200 participants all around Europe and was sold-out!

Participants had the opportunity to attend various workshops and key-notes on three different sites: the universities of Saarland, Luxembourg and Strasbourg were home to panels ranging from breaking the gender bias in medical research to integrating Al in our daily practice but also topics focused on physician's wellbeing and the different career paths and journeys a Family Doctor might experience. The final keynote focused on our impact on the environment and on how we can do our best to tackle climate change from our position as young doctors.

The Forum provided the opportunity of an Exchange in one of the organising countries; 30 participants had the opportunity to discover the differences and similarities of General Practice in these neighbouring countries.

At EYFDM, we always strive to have our events as accessible and inclusive as possible; EYFDM and HOC bursaries were given out to participants and nursery rooms were made available on site so as to accommodate participants with children.


